

What is ESA's National Digital Learning Resource Network?

- NDLRN (TLF) is funded by governments of Australia, Australian states and territories
- ESA manages it a pool of commissioned and licensed digital curriculum resources to support teaching and learning and the infrastructure
- The resources are available free to all schools through education jurisdictions and sectors (government, independent, Catholic)
- Currently > 10,000 items in the content pool
- Each NDLRN (TLF) asset has a unique ID number (e.g. L2353) so it can be easily found in a digital repository.



SHEX: content plus metadata zip and ship to all jurisdictions

or

MEX: a metadata record only is sent to all jurisdictions where it links through to the content on the owners website.







What are students doing?


- Being inquisitive?
