	Some Generalities • You engage in whole of government network acquisition processes and buy services. • You hide your network behind big firewalls; • You constrain external access into your network to small commodity internet pipes; and • You interconnect jurisdictions through the internet

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Objectives • Improve outcomes for members • Create a richer and more productive research and education environment for the nation • Build relationships with the health sector with a long term view to collaboration around infrastructure Strategies • Undertake a dialogue and education process with the various jurisdictions and interest groups • Promote and test the feasibility of a national health research, innovation and training network	The Way it was! 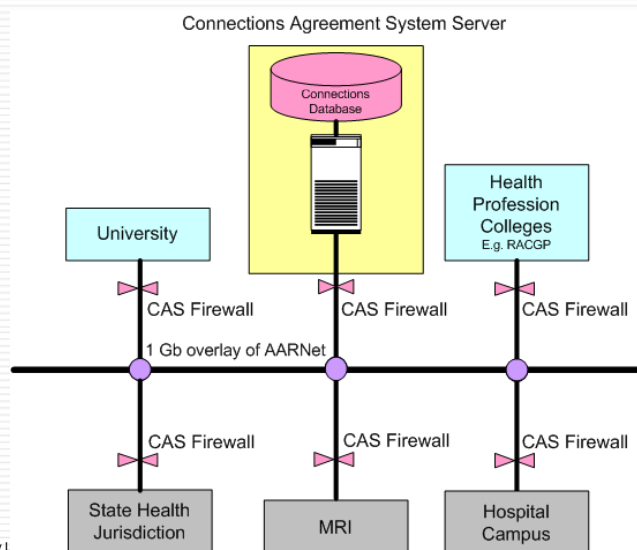
What is it?

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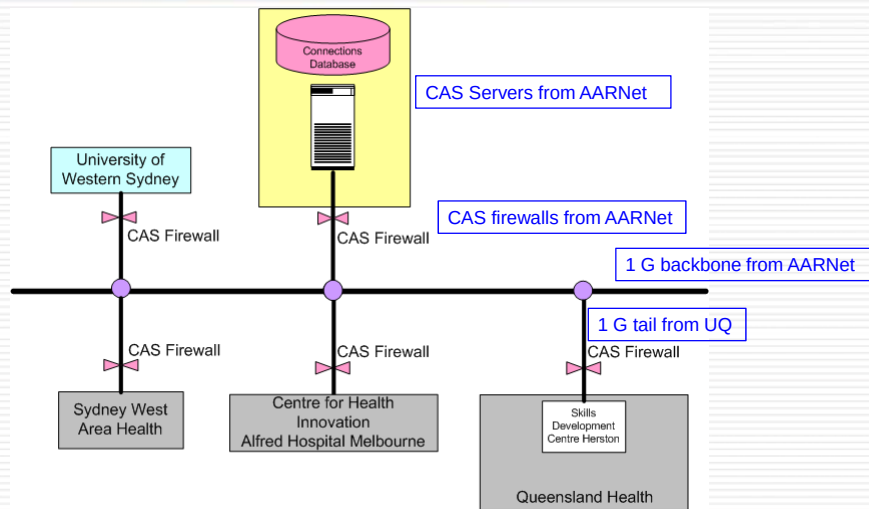
What an ANHITN might look like



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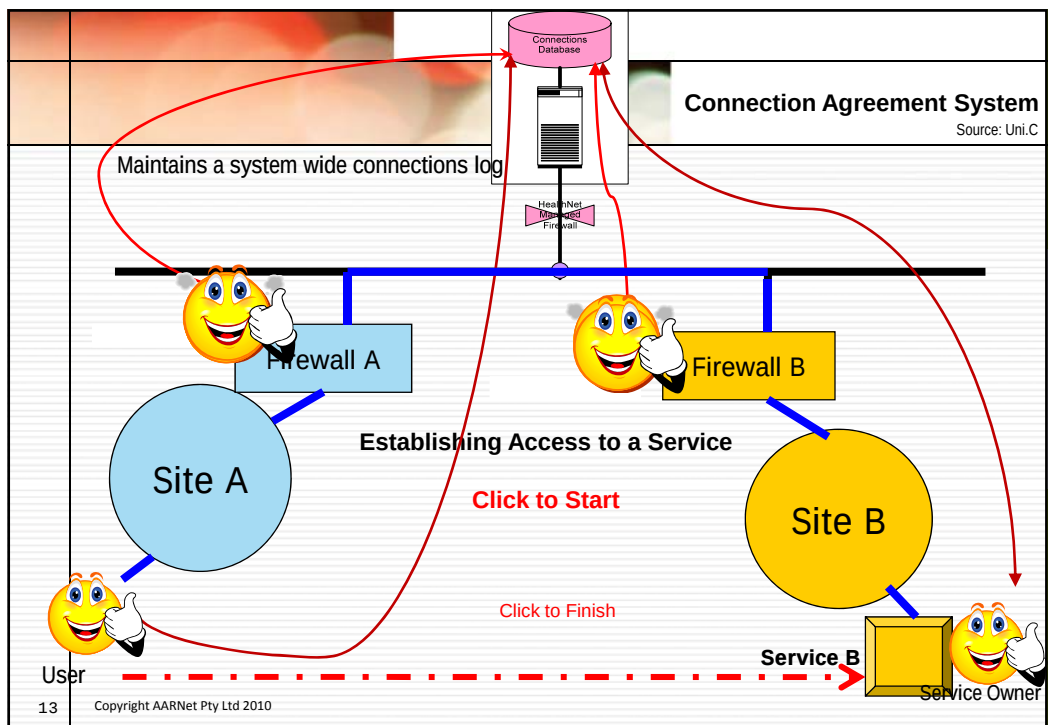
